They form where the water meets the earth.
They include mangroves, peatlands, bathers, rivers and lakes, deltas, floodplains and flooded forests, rice paddies and also coral reefs.

Mangroves are a type of wetland that provide protection and shelter from extreme weather events such as storms, winds and floods.
