

"Pantanal is regulated by the pulse of the waters. It is this cycle of floods and ebbings that keeps it and makes it unique in the world ", this is the way the executive director of Wetlands International Brazil, Rafaela Nicola, explains the source of inspiration for the choice of the name of the Impulsa initiative. Pantanal that foresees efforts for the restoration, conservation and promotion of sustainable practices for the biome that is considered to be the largest floodplain area on the planet.

Launched on November
12, a date that marks
the Pantanal Day.

and short term actions.

Considering that the Pantanal

is going through an extreme situation, we need to understand the new contexts and react with satisfaction: the fires that reached historical levels affecting more than 30% of the region, one of the biggest drought periods ever recorded. In addition to the harmful effects of the pandemic with traditional communities losing their livelihoods and increasingly vulnerable to contamination.

It was launched on November 12, when Pantanal Day is celebrated along with the release of the book "Pantanal à Margem da Lei" in English, Pantanal on the edge of the Law". It initiated a series of lectures and dialogues key to the Pantanal. Impulsa Pantanal appears as a response to the socio-environmental demands triggered by the scenario that plagues the Pantanal in 2020.

It was inspired by the greater awareness that society has been showing regarding the theme by engaging in currents of good and solidarity actions as it even accompanies and demands more actions from the government.

The Initiative is designed by many hands. Mupan - Women in Action in the Pantanal, Wetlands International are the creators and have the support of the Pantanal Research Center (CPP), National Institute of Science and Technology in Wetlands (INAU), SOS Pantanal Institute and Sesc Pantanal. A collective effort to promote effective actions in the Pantanal that guarantee quality

for the environment and the maintenance of the lifestyles of local populations, economies and culture.

"I often say that it's like an umbrella. There will be several actions developed that will culminate in a single purpose, to conserve the biome and foster the resilience of communities. Pointing out that the main focus is not assistance in itself, but to enable mechanisms that bring more autonomy to those who live in the region ", says Áurea Garcia, policy officer for Wetlands International Brazil and general director of Mupan, institutions that created Impulsa Pantanal.

In order to promote actions in the territory, the initiative combines efforts of various actors: from the private sector, research institutions, non-governmental organizations to marshland communities, calling civil society to collaborate with the activities.



Impulsa Pantanal foresees short-term and longterm actions in the Brazilian Pantanal, in the states of Mato Grosso and Mato Grosso do Sul, a border region with Bolivia and Paraguay. This schedule provide:
